Membership Committee/Book Sale (Coffey)

Membership:

- In January, we gained 9 new members. Six of those were during the book sale. Twenty members renewed their membership, 10 of those during the book sale. One new member, John Kurtz, also volunteered during the book sale.
- We have a total of 190 current members, and 40 members which have not renewed during 2014.
- I am turning in \$375.00 in dues and \$100.00 in donations for a total of \$475.00.

Book Sale:

- The book sale was very successful. Gross income from sale of books \$4,661.80. Book bags \$16.
- Check from Book Consignments \$ 1,276.62. Total Gross income = \$6,100.42.
- Expenses to be deducted include Ash & T's \$255.00, Building Rental \$250.00, Book Storage \$400.00 (Oct, 2014-Jan, 2015), Advertising (Estimated \$180).
- Estimated Net Income: \$3576.80

Positive things about the book sale:

- 1. Awesome volunteers 30 who helped set up and sort the books on Thursday and Friday. Thank you so much. Cannot have a successful book sale without everyone's help. 33 volunteers who helped during the sale and breakdown Sunday evening.
 - 2. More space, especially between the aisles.
 - 3. Advertising a lot of comments that they saw the road signs and came by.
 - 4. Not over crowded with books. Very few boxes were on the floor.
- 5. Opening to the public on Friday. That was our biggest day. Saturday sales were about the same. Things to work on.
- 1. Making books available to other charities and organizations. Need to address when they can come pick up books. Did not have anyone except Habitat for Humanity take books for their organization.
 - 2. Better organization for breakdown after the sale on Sunday evening.
 - 3. Better security for handling cash.
 - 4. Plastic baskets for shoppers.
