Advocacy Committee Report – D. Lodge

Jennifer Armenti, a member of the Outreach group, has created a colorful, upbeat presentation about our library. You can view it at our new Facebook page that she also created. The page is called ADVOCATES FOR SUMMERVILLE LIBRARY.

The Speakers group, spearheaded by Beverly Brockman and assisted by Ellen Hyatt, Donna Underwood, and Sandra Baden, has been firming up their presentation. The presentation is meant to be used when speaking to outside groups. Jennie Redmond, DCL Library Director, has created a flyer that can be used for our outreach events. Robyn Dudley first proposed the idea and provided input on the content of the flyer. Robyn has also been working with the Friends of the Library outreach crew to set up a Third Thursday outreach opportunity for Library Advocacy. Beverly Brockman and Robyn Dudley also wrote positive but persuasive letters to their County Council Representatives when the Advocacy Committee became aware that some of those representatives were not cooperating with

Providence, the consulting firm hired by the Library.

The "What's Your Story?" Writing Contest deadline has been extended until Monday, March 21st. We have several submissions in the adult category but none so far in the Children's or Teen category. And finally, I have contacted the office of Jason Ward, the County Administrator for Dorchester County, regarding the possibility of getting road signs (with the Universal Library logo) erected on Trolley Road in order to increase the visibility of the library. Mr. Ward and his assistant were both out of town but I was assured my email would be passed to him upon his return. I will be following up on this if I do not hear from Mr. Ward's office very soon.
